#### State of the Education Report for India-2021

On the occasion of World Teacher's Day, "United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO)" released its "State of the Education Report (SOER)-2021 for India: No Teachers, No Class", on October 5, 2021. This report is the annual flagship publication of UNESCO New Delhi. Report is prepared on the basis of extensive research.

#### School education scheme extended for 5 years

Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has approved the continuation of 'Samagra Shiksha Scheme' for school education for further five years. As per the education minister, Dharmendra Pradhan, scheme would continue from April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2026. Samagra Shiksha is an integrated scheme for school education. It extends from pre-school to class XII and ensures inclusive & equitable quality education at all the levels of school education. This scheme provides holistic treatment to school education from Pre-school to Class 12.

#### e-Saksham



eSaksham is a scheme that has been launched by The Ministry of Education in association with All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), along with CyberPeace Foundation. eSaksham is a digital training programme that focuses on developing the skills of five lakh college students and teachers in the domain of cyber security.

#### **India-Microsoft MoU on Digital Transformation of Tribal Schools**

On May 17, 2021, the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and Microsoft signed a Memorandum of Understanding on joint initiative for Digital Transformation of Tribal Schools. This includes introduction of Ashram Schools and Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRS) in tribal areas. Microsoft will make an Artificial Intelligence curriculum available for the tribal students in Hindi and English. The teachers will also be provided with E-Certificates and E-badges from the Microsoft Education centres at the end of the programme.

#### Vidya Deevena Scheme of Andhra Pradesh



The Andhra Pradesh Government recently released Rs 686 crores for the Vidya Deevena Scheme. This is the third tranche of the scheme. It is an education assistance scheme. The Vidya Deevena Scheme provides scholarships (in terms of fee reimbursements) to students who are not able to pay their college fees. The scheme mainly focuses on students seeking higher education.

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

The second season of Kota Factory begins with a war cry. "Unrewarded geniuses are not geniuses but clichés," Maheshwari sir announces in a matter-of-fact tone to a class full of aspirants, that sucks the colour, quite literally out of the image on screen.

The first few minutes of this season sees Kota draped in colour before it recedes to the black and white tonality of the first season. It suggests that reality, its grating epiphanies do not necessarily elevate the world around you. It momentarily rescues you from its inevitabilities. As Vaibhav Pandey (Mayur More) takes his oath of Maheshwari classes, the wiped grin from his face echoes the war-like nature of an Indian life. To outgrow its ordinariness, you have to fight battles. Despite its lack of ingenuity and other false notes, through this season of Kota Factory, creators The Viral Fever (TVF) — often criticised for their safe cinema — have finally pushed the envelope.

The world which the child lives in, their knowledge, experiences and perceptions are kept as far away from school as possible. What helps achieve this division is a clearly defined syllabus, textbooks, classroom processes, evaluation procedures.

## This Young Girl's Hilarious Rant About Schools and the Indian Educational System is All Too Real



A little girl's rant about going to school and how the education system in India needed changes has left people on social media in splits (and nostalgic).

Let's face it, no child enjoys waking up early in the morning and rushing to get ready in order to get to school on time.

The girl from Gujarat was shown in a viral video whining about having to get up at 6 a.m. for school, quickly get ready, and attend back-to-back lessons. She also had a vengeance in mind for everyone who started attending school. The 1-minute-long video was first shared on Twitter by Police Officer Arun Bothra, in which the girl was demanding for freedom from school for a month. In the video, the girl could be seen speaking in Gujarati and was full of rage as she complained about getting up, brushing, eating, having milk, getting ready for school, quickly catching the school bus and so on. She further complained that after reaching school one had to attend a prayer, then study English, Math, EVS, Gujarati, general knowledge.

"Poore mahine... Pehle prayer, fir English, fir Maths, fir EVS, fir Gujarati, fir GK" she complained. What is more funny about the video is that the girl then added" "GK matlab Maths". When the person recording the video asked the girl what would she do to the person who came up with the concept of schools, she responded by saying, "Main usse dho ke na, puri paani mein daal ke istri kar daalungi (I'll wash that person, splash water on and him/her out)" without skipping a bit.

The video was fittingly captioned as: "The person who started schools in this world is in serious danger. This girl is searching for him."

Since being posted, the video has been viewed over 2 lakh 78 thousand times and has garnered over 9,400 likes. Many users called the video hilarious, while others, recalling their own school days, have said it is relatable. Some even said that there should, in fact, be a change in the education system. Delhi Deputy Chief Minister and Education Minister Manish Sisodia also commented on the video saying, "Oh my God! A school should be opened for the ones who build and run the school... and this girl will be the principal of the school."





Interestingly, Indian society is divided in multiple layers based on caste, class, ethnicity, gender, etc., making conflict an everyday phenomenon in their lives. This differentiated positioning of the child impacts rather directly their identities and experiences. For example, a Dalit child, especially from a rural area, learns very early in life that they will be discriminated against in almost every walk of life—place where they live, their access to basic human rights such as land, water and basic facilities, and their interactions with others. The Indian education system, however, plays it safe and turns a blind eye to all the ugliness of the society. It neither acknowledges conflict, nor entertains any discussion or query around it. That must be accepted and students must be trained in acknowledging the harsh reality of world. Learning and assessment in schools should assist the children in pure learning rather than quizzing them what they may not know.

#### **International Virtual Conference**

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

#### **Out Reach Programs**

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

The objective of the National Nutrition Week is to enhance the nutritional practice awareness among people of the community through the adoptable training to build a healthy Nation.








#### Virtual Workshop on "PLANET LIFECYCLES"

11th July 2021






World Population Day is observed every year on July 11. The main purpose of this day is to draw attention towards the issues arising out of rising population across the globe.


#### **National Sports Day**

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
