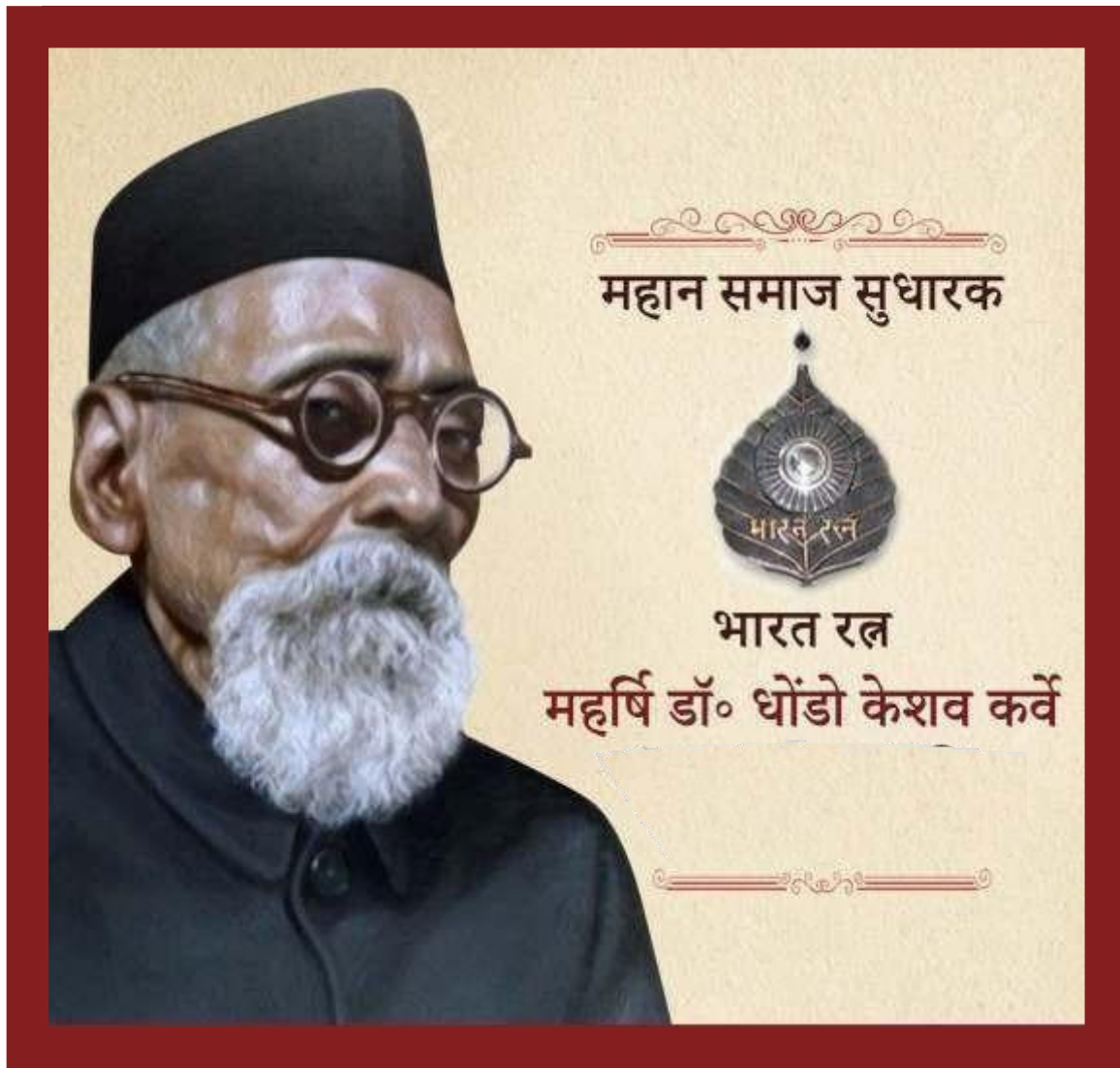

SNDT is the first university in Maharashtra to obtain a five-star rating from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) of India in the year 2000 and was reaccredited with 'A' grade in 2015.



SNDT Women's University is the first Women's university in India as well as in South–East Asia. The University was founded by Maharshi Dr. Dhondo Keshav Karve in 1916 for a noble cause of Women's Education. The first five women graduated in 1921 from this University. The University Headquarters is in Churchgate Campus, Mumbai and the other two campuses of this University are at Juhu, Mumbai and Karve Road, Pune.

In a century old existence, the university has grown into a multidisciplinary institution hosting diverse professional, technical and liberal arts programmes from K12 to PhD. ### Library

The Library of the Institute uses Open Source Library Management Software -KOHA which also has Web Based Online Public Access catalogue (Web OPAC). Library has Membership of N-List for e-journals, e-Shodh Sindhu, Shodhganga, e-books etc.,. The library at SCE maintains the record of the entire requirement to cater to the need of students. It has incorporated collections of prints, visuals, and creative resources which are systematically organized with different sources from India and abroad. The list of books is being upgraded as per the requirement from time to time.

### Language Laboratory

SCE is well equipped with ORELL DIGITAL LANGUAGE LAB with the capacity of 25 students. ODLL is a professionally engineered, comprehensive and user-friendly language learning software by ORELL, India. It offers the instructor an opportunity to not only teach efficiently but also monitor the progress of each students individually. For the learner, it offers an interactive learning experience as well as the opportunity to self-evaluate her progress.

### ICT Laboratory

SCE ICT Lab is very well equipped with desktops, interconnected in a Local Area Network with a central server system. The campus is Wi-Fi enabled. Unique login IDs have been issued to students and the faculty for access. It has a full-time system administrator. Students make effective use of ICT lab in planning of their lessons and nurture technical skills.

### Science Laboratory

Science lab provides an opportunity to bring theory into practice. The laboratory is fully equipped with required equipment. Students get a first-hand learning experience by performing various experiments on their own. Students are made to use the models and understand different scientific theories and concepts.

### Mathematics Resource Centre

Mathematics resource Centre acts like a concomitant between teacher and students and provides an opportunity to understand and discover the beauty, importance and relevance of mathematics as a discipline. SCE has a well-equipped Mathematics resource centre for its trainee teachers assisting them to become good mathematics teachers.

### Social Science Resource Centre

Satyam College of Education possess well equipped and fully functional Social Science Resource Centre. Social studies resource centre provides a quick and ready functional environment which not merely provides theoretical but also practical knowledge.

### Psychology Laboratory

## **Report - Basant Panchami**

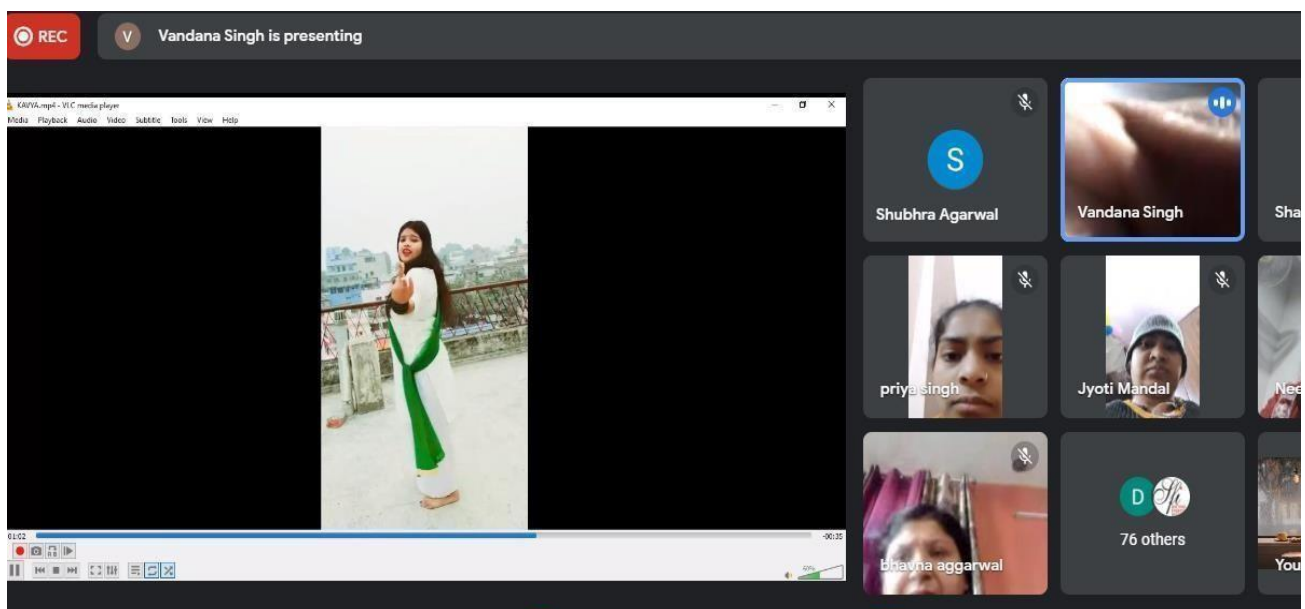

The college library activities are automated using the complete modern Web – based Open Source Solution i.e. KOHA, Internationally renowned Integrated Library Management System. We are one of the leading college libraries using KOHA Open Source Library. In addition to the Above, we are using SARAL software in the Library.

The library is fully automated through KOHA cloud which enables easy access of the library catalogue from anywhere anytime. Students, Faculty and Staff members can easily check the status of the library resources by accessing the Online Public Access Catalogue.

To enhance the Cashless environment, library is maintaining proper late fines on respective title of each and every student and generating reports from KOHA as well. It gives the clear picture of students' library account and adds transparency to the library system.

Library has Hindi Literature books and a separate section of books for Economically Weaker Section Students. All the library resources are Library Card and software has been installed at the check desk for analyzing the foot falls of students visiting the library.


## Workshop on 'Introduction of Research Methodology'

### A Paradigm shift in the Education Policy via New National Education Policy 2020

**E**ducation plays an important role in shaping of an individuals, society & our country. Through education one learns various skill sets which help him in their career progress, self awareness and choosing the right path and goal in life. Education is the ladder which guides us in choosing what is right and what is wrong, education make us independent, confident, inculcates values and virtues.

Governments make changes in policies from time to time taking into consideration the present need and overall benefit to the individual, Society, & the Country. The Policies provides direction. My blog is about the new National education policy 2020(NEP 2020), its genesis, main features. The new NEP 2020 comes into force on 29th July 2020 after the approval of Union Cabinet India. The new NEP2020 replaced the erstwhile National Policy on Education 1986 which means that new Education policy comes into being after a gap of 34 Years after the need was felt by Educationist, Industry, Society, & policymakers. The NEP 2020 is the 3rd major change of the framework of education in India since independence. Earlier two were in year 1968 & 1986.

The need of overhauling the Education system was felt. Industry demand required skilled qualified student with both the hard skills and soft skills which can be possible through a proper education system. Industry was concerned of the skill gaps of the passing out graduates who does not possesses the requisite skills and are not fit for the jobs. This article also highlighted that competency gap was mainly because of Theory based learning and lack of internship/ project work. Serious need was felt to invest and build skills among the student and integrate an effective apprenticeship program in the Education curriculum.

NEP 2020 covers for a frameworks for elementary to higher education. The policy also include vocational training to rural and urban students providing them the required skill sets at a early stage. Need of vocational training is a very well thought of idea which gives students a chance to learn new skill sets, have a hand on approach to practical things. These skill sets will help student stand on their own and help them choose their future and also to some extent help them become "Atmanirbhar" or become and entrepreneur, help them innovate, generate new ideas and become a job creator than becoming a job seeker.

*Genesis*

A committee was formed in 2015 under former Cabinet secretary Mr T.S.R. Subramanian to initiate the process for a new Education policy. Draft NEP was prepared and submitted in 2019 by a panel headed by Mr.Krishnaswamy Kasturirangan. Around 2 lakhs suggestions were received on the draft NEP 2020 from various Individuals/ organisations, gram panchayats, Urban local bodies/Municipalities, Districts. The final draft was approved by the Union Cabinet of India on 29th July 2020. Important provisions of NEP 2020, Expenditure on Education: NEP 2020 envisages that the state government Expenditure on Education should be increased to 8% of the GDP from present 4%.



The Sports Cell of SCE was established with the objective to inspire students to be physically fit, strong and energetic by engaging in physical and mental exercises, enhancing the sportsmanship attitude and learning of management principles viz. leadership, team work, problem solving etc. through participation in sports.

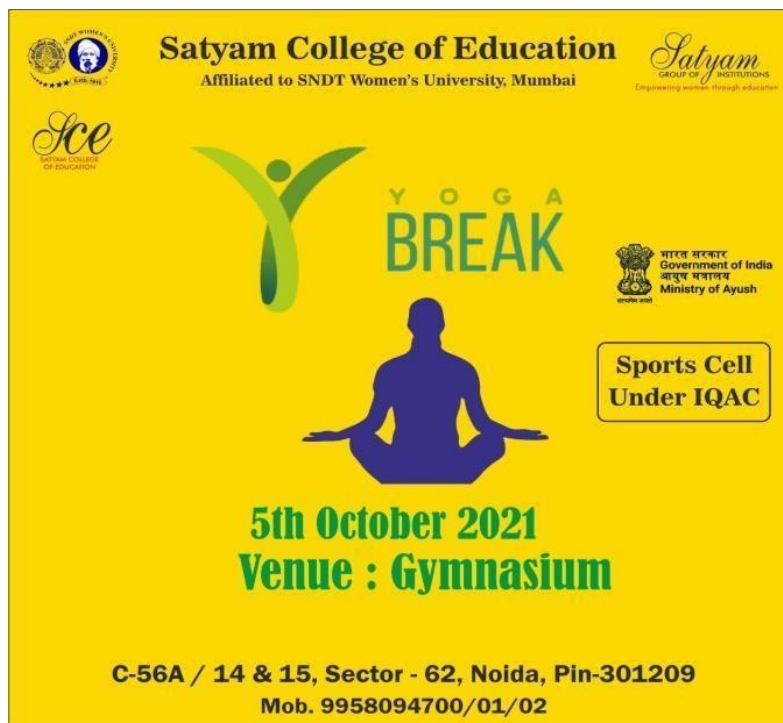
Fit India Movement is a nation-wide movement in India to encourage people to remain healthy and fit by including physical activities and sports in their daily lives.
